




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Video Game Design

Make Space for Pollinators Thursday, June 16th at 2 PM

Jerry Schneider, presenter of the popular "Bats: Sounds in Silence" program in 2018 and creator of the award winning Butterfly Game, returns to Somerset County Library at 2 pm on Thursday, June 16 to teach us about some of our local pollinators, featuring bees, bats, hummingbirds, beetles, dragonflies and and butterflies. Pollinators are important critters that help pollinate our orchards, back yard gardens, and Earth's rain forests.

Attendees will learn how to build and maintain yards and gardens that help our pollinator populations. Jerry will answer questions like "What time of year is mowing fields the most beneficial to pollinators?" and "What about all those dandelions in our yards?".

After the slide show, children (and adults if you wish) will create pollinator tee shirts, using a combination of fabric dye sprays, plants, and butterfly, bat and dragonfly cut outs. Children may purchase heavy cotton (Gildan) tee shirts for \$4.00, or bring their own.


Support your library through a donation
