




Book-to-Movie Club

In addition to the many special workshops and summer STEAM camps, a weekly **STEAM Club** on Mondays at 6 PM and a monthly **Inventor's Club** on the 1st Saturday of each month at 1 PM encourage attendees to explore a variety of topics in science, technology, engineering, arts, and math through hands-on activities.
